What is GHS?

Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labeling of Chemicals – an initiative to improve employee safety by standardizing: chemical labels, Safety Data Sheets and pictograms.



In the US, chemicals are a **\$450 Billion Business**

43 Million Workers are affected by chemical hazards

585 Number of injuries and illness the revised GHS standard will prevent annually

43 Expected number of fatalities prevented per year With the new GHS standard

GHS Hazard Pictograms

IDENTIFY hazards found in chemicals

CLASSIFY hazards

Visually WARN employees

Explosives, Flammable, Oxidizing, Compressed Gas, Harmful/Irritant, Dangerous for the Environment, Health Hazard, Corrosive, Toxic

GHS Label Elements

Signal Words
Hazard Statement
Precautionary Statement

MSDS is now SDS (Safety Data Sheet)

Standardized information on:

- Composition
- Handling
- Potential Dangers
